Duties and Responsibilities:

- Continue to expand and improve the quality of program activities offered
- Lead watershed canoe tours, kid programs and guided hikes
- Organize movie nights, music evenings and evening presentations.
- Develop and distribute marketing materials for programs
- Perform office shifts when required (shoulder season): provide excellent customer service by taking reservations, making sales and answering customer inquiries.
- Perform park operations shifts when required (shoulder season): maintain park in a safe and tidy condition by performing water testing, sweeping, raking, bathroom cleaning, recycling and garbage sorting, litter pick up and other related duties.
- Perform watersports rental shifts when required (shoulder season):completing paperwork, taking reservations, fitting guests with safety gear, assisting with launch and returns, and cleaning boats.
- Perform all other related duties as required.
